2024 State Show Information & Conditions

1. Nominations are to be RECEIVED no later than 11.59 pm Monday 22nd April 2024.

Entries received after this date will attract a \$30 late fee per event. Late entries to classes will be accepted, but only for horses that have previously been nominated before the closing date. Late entries need to be submitted to the office through Nominate no later than 4.00 pm the day prior to the commencement of that event. These late entries will be placed at the top of the draw. All scratching should also come to the Office to be processed through Nominate.

- 2. All entries will be through Nominate completed by the competitor.
- 3. For RA sanctioned events, owners and riders must be current financial members of RA and horse must have RA competition license. If these are not current Nominate will not allow entries to proceed.
- 4. COMPETITORS NOTE Please check the draw posted each day as there can be changes to what is printed in the program.
- 5. NO refund will be given for entry fee: Exceptions a vet certificate must be provided prior to commencement of show (Tuesday am) before any requests for refunds will be considered.
- 6. A copy of the biosecurity Horse Health Declaration must accompany entries.
- 7. The working order will be drawn and will be posted all late entries will run first.
- 8. All sanctioned classes will be run in accordance with the RA Rule Book.
- 9. Horses that are entered for both events in concurrent run class will only have one run and the score will count for both events and will therefore <u>only pay one Judges Fee</u> and Video Fee upon nomination.
- 10. By way of making an entry you are assuming responsibility for and binding owner, rider and/or agent to the terms and conditions as set out. The indemnity and consent form accompanying entry form must be completed and signed or entries will not be accepted.
- 11. All exhibitors will be subject to the use of photographers and videographers under the direction of Show Management, the results of which may be used at the discretion of QRHA for promotional purposes.
- 12. Show Management reserves the right to extend or alter this program, once final entry numbers are known.
- 13. In all RA approved classes with added monies of \$500 or below (in a concurrent class set, the Threshold applies to the highest added money offered), a random Equipment Check by the chair judge is permitted. It is recommended at least three horses in each class are checked, selected by the chair judge when each horse is finished with the pattern. Any horse, at any time may be stopped by the Chair judge in the event of abuse or unsafe conditions.
- 14. Reining Australia eligibility caps are used throughout the Show. It is the responsibility of the **owner or rider** to be aware of the official earnings of the horse/or rider as recorded by Reining Australia. Ineligibility List is on the RA Website.
- 15. The QRHA will retain 50% of the entry fee in jackpot classes.
- 16. **Open Pen rules will be enforced**. Number of horses in the Pen at one given time is limited to 16. Left circles entry end of arena, right circles top end of arena. Circles and turnarounds for the first 30 minutes of the hour. Rundowns and stops for the last 30 minutes of the hour. Horses are not to be rested in the centre of the arena. The tractor has the right of way at all times during Open Pen.
- 17. Age of Futurity horses is 4 years, to be shown one handed in a bridle or two handed in a Snaffle Bit.
- 18. Age of Derby horses is 5,6,7, and 8, to be shown one handed in a bridle.
- 19. It is mandatory to enter the Level 4 of Aged Events to be able to enter the Intermediate Level 3, Limited Level 2 Divisions.
- 20. RA Green Rider all riders must be enrolled in the RA Green Rider program. Only one level can be entered not both.
- 21. Para Reining: Para equestrians who wish to compete in Para Reining classes using compensating aids should have filled out a RA Classification and Medical Form and have Grading on file.
- 22. Each individual horse is allowed a maximum of 10 minutes of Paid Warmups for the entire show.

- 23. Only financial RA/QRHA members are permitted to ride on the grounds for the duration of the event.
- 24. All Youth riders 13 years and under MUST wear an approved safety helmet at all times whilst mounted. refer RA policy of the website. Any Youth aged 18 years and under must not ride or handle any Stallion- refer RA policy on the website.
- 25. DOGS must be kept at campsites. **No dogs allowed in grandstand, marshalling area or in vicinity of Canteen.** All dog droppings must be picked up, especially in the stable area.
- 26. No smoking in the main arena grandstand. Please use designated smoking areas.
- 27. All competitors riding on the grounds must have saddles and bridle and correct footwear at all times.
- 28. QSEC is **NO GLASS** Venue.
- 29. All horses must display the correct exhibitor number. Failure to display the number, or displaying the wrong exhibitor number, may incur a fine (\$25) this will be at the discretion of Show Management.
- 30. Event participants are required to make their own on-line booking and payment for stables, and camping sites. Bookings are done by going to the QSEC Website. Competitors will be notified when stable and camping bookings are open. Bookings close at 8:00 AM Monday 29 April otherwise a \$25 late fee will apply.
- 31. Management reserves the right to decline any nominations deemed incomplete or incorrect in any way.
- **32. Show Attire**: Attire required for showing, when you enter the arena to show, you must be wearing a western hat or safety helmet, long sleeved western shirt with sleeves buttoned down and western boots, your horse must have a western saddle and western bridle. Failure to have correct attire upon entering the arena will results in a no score.
- **33. Presentations** All competitors/handlers to be dressed in appropriate western attire including Western hat during presentation and to be astride in the line-up.
- 34. Any Accident, injury, concern, complaint to be reported to the **Show Representative Tim Hoffmann** or **Show manager Karen Lowe**

<u>QRHA NON-SANCTIONED EVENTS</u> – MUST BE A MEMBER OF QRHA OR RA

BEGINNER RIDER/HORSE: Restricted to riders who have not won more than 3 Reining events.

(sanctioned/non sanctioned) as at 1st January 2024 JUNIOR REINING HORSE: For horses five years & under.

SENIOR REINING HORSE: For horses six years and over.

CHALLENGE CLASSES – to be ridden two handed in snaffle bit – Western or Fender saddle accepted for Encouragement Fender saddle for Open.

Western attire and Saddlery not compulsory in these non-sanctioned classes however a long-sleeved shirt and hat or helmet required (no caps). Riders may use one or two hands on the reins or change from one handed to two handed throughout the performance. Any <u>legal</u> headgear is allowed.
